All proceeds to support pop-up community cultural events promoting walking, cycling, active travel and local living in the Chichester District. This will aid delivery of the following objects that benefit Chichester District Council residents:

- The UK is experiencing a health crisis due to its population lacking access to adequate opportunities for daily exercise. Through campaigning/lobbying for improved walking and cycling infrastructure in the Chichester District that meets standards laid out in National guidelines for walking and cycling, all members of our community can potentially enjoy the health benefits gained from using active travel modes of transport.
- Through campaigning/lobbying for improved walking and cycling infrastructure in the Chichester District that meets (or exceeds) standards laid out in National guidelines for walking and cycling, the health of local students will be improved by them being better able to use active travel modes to get to and from their places of education.
- Residents who choose not to rely on motor vehicles for transport, or residents who are unable to drive, experience transport poverty. Through campaigning/lobbying for improved walking and cycling infrastructure in the Chichester District that meets (or exceeds) standards laid out in National guidelines for walking and cycling, residents currently experiencing transport poverty will experience improved standards of living by being able to more easily walk or cycle to places in the community.
- Community identity, engagement and cohesion will be improved through ChiCycle staging the pop-up eco-fair cultural events in the city's public spaces.


